

Guidelines and Helpful Hints for a Fun Camas Egg Scramble!

(Normal Egg Hunt on Grass)

(refer to accompanying site map - Dorothy Fox School, 2023 NW 23rd Ave.)

HIGHLIGHTS:

- All ages start the egg hunt at the same time - promptly at 1:30PM! Don't be late!
- No registration required.
- Event is held rain or shine. Prepare for wet grass and possibly mud.
- Chocolate candies in the eggs may contain nuts or come from a facility that manufactures products with nuts. A "Candy Exchange" basket will be available at the Prize Tent.
- Expect LARGE crowds and organized, fun chaos in this unique, speedy and short event!

When you arrive:

- Arrive early to park your vehicle. Parking near Dorothy Fox School becomes more difficult the closer you get to the egg hunt start time (1:30PM). Additional Accessible Parking spots and Drop-off are located in the school parking lot, off NW Sierra St.
- Find the age-appropriate egg hunting section for your child (children). Kiddos must be accompanied by an adult. The information tent can be found near the portable building.
- Staff, in blue vests, and volunteers, in orange vests, can help you find your scramble zone.

Egg Hunt (1:30PM Sharp!):

- ALL AGES START THE EGG HUNT AT THE SAME TIME - promptly at 1:30PM.
- There are six designated egg scramble zones (refer to accompanying site map):

Ages 2-3 will hunt in the **pink-ribboned** area, closest to the portable (west side)

Ages 4-5 will hunt in the **white-ribboned** area, in the playground (south-west)

Ages 6-7 will hunt in the **green-ribboned** area, next to the playground (south side)

Ages 8-9 will hunt in the **blue-ribboned** area, along NW 28th Ave. (north)

Ages 10-12 will hunt in the **yellow-ribboned** area, along NW 28th Ave. (north)

"Adaptive Egg Stroll" for Special Accessibility Needs (all ages) will hunt in the green-fenced area, south section of school. See below for times.

Adults are **NOT** allowed in the egg hunt areas except in area for ages 2 - 3 and the special accessibility "Adaptive Egg Activity" sections.

Adaptive Egg Activities (1:30 - 2:30PM; south section of school):

- All ages with special accessibility needs welcome! No registration required.
- Egg Stroll is an open house format; arrive and depart at your leisure.
- Activities designed in partnership with Camas School District special education.
- Area is fenced for safety.
- Prizes and candy in eggs with exchanges available. Beeping eggs on site.
- Accessible parking spots (as available) and vehicle drop-off area located off NW Sierra St.

What to do with my eggs:

- Make sure you **open ALL of your eggs to see if you have a prize token.** Eggs are filled with candy (some including nuts), toys and prize tokens. This year's prize tokens are quarter-sized colored plastic tokens that are printed with "Turn in for PRIZE" on one side and "Camas Parks & Recreation" on the other side. You'll turn in each token for a prize at the Prize Token Turn-in Line (see map).
- Recycle your eggs in the collection cans nearest your egg hunt area. We will reuse them for next year, reducing waste and keeping our event expenses down.
- Open eggs **before** you enter the Prize Token Turn-in Line.

Easter Bunny (12:30 - 2:30PM) - Dorothy Fox Garden Beds (behind portable building):

- The Easter Bunny will be available for photos before and after the egg hunt. Easter Bunny will take breaks as needed (bunny snack break, of course!)
- Expect long lines. Please be patient.
- Bring your camera or cell phone for photos. Staff and volunteers will be available to assist in taking photos.

Bonnet/Hat Contest (2:00PM - school overhang - see map):

- All ages welcome! Ages categories judged: 2-3; 4-5; 6-7; 8-9; 10-12; 13-17; 18 & older.
- Hats and bonnets will be judged on hand-crafted/decorated originality and creativity.
- All participants will receive a ribbon and a small treat bag. Winners will receive additional prizes.

Other Tips and Rules:

- If you become separated from your parent/guardian or child, or if you find a misplaced child, please come to the Family Meet-Up area next to the Announcing Tent (see map). We will make an announcement over the PA system.
- Be patient. Be courteous. This is a large family event for our community.
