PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This Professional Services Agreement ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between the City of Camas, a Washington Municipal Corporation, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and Camas-Washougal Economic Development Association, a Washington public non-profit and recognized associated public entity, hereinafter referred to as "CWEDA" for professional services in the form of Economic Development Director to be provided by CWEDA to the City. This PSA is consistent with the Interlocal Agreement between the City and the City of Washougal and Port of Camas-Washougal.

1. Scope of Work. CWEDA will provide economic development services to the City, as set forth herein and as requested by the City.

Services. CWEDA shall provide economic development services to the City that includes the following specific duties:

- Assist in maintenance of CWEDA, including the following tasks:
 - Maintenance of and updating the by-laws that identify roles and responsibilities of the governing board as well as the contractor/President of CWEDA, and other tasks as necessary for the effective operation of CWEDA, within resources made available by the Governing Board.
 - Financial management and reporting, including working with the Finance Directors of the City of Camas, City of Washougal and Port of Camas-Washougal, who will rotate biennially to provide financial oversight and assistance to CWEDA (the Washougal Finance Director is assigned for the 2019-2020 biennium).
 - Maintenance of CWEDA web site that provides information about CWEDA and the Camas-Washougal communities including contact information, demographics, real estate inventory, and other pertinent materials as directed by the Governing Board. Website should stay updated on a monthly basis along with confirming that links are working for real estate inventory, save any technology issues that may arise or platform becoming obsolete that is clearly out of the control of CWEDA. Such issues will be resolved in a timely fashion and as resources are made available by the Governing Board.
- Strategic Planning Services CWEDA will utilize the comprehensive plans for the cities of Camas and Washougal, comprehensive Scheme/Strategic Plan for the Port of Camas-Washougal, and CREDC's Strategic Plan (if deemed applicable by the Governing Board) as guidance for serving the economic needs of the Camas-Washougal area. Services will include developing and implementing measures for creating a business friendly environment, attracting new businesses to the Camas-Washougal area, assisting existing businesses with expansion plans and helping to retain existing businesses.
- Establish Real Estate Inventory CWEDA will develop and maintain an inventory of land and buildings available for business development within the City of Camas boundaries.


- Provide Status Reports CWEDA will provide quarterly status reports to the Governing Board. CWEDA will also provide an annual report to the elected officials of Camas, Washougal and Port of Camas-Washougal.
- Develop Business Contacts CWEDA will contact businesses quarterly to develop a good working relationship with existing businesses as well as generate business development leads and recruit new or assist existing businesses in the area. This information should be included in the quarterly status report
- o **Report Annually** on the following benchmarks to be achieved by CWEDA:
 - Number of businesses contacted
 - Direct and indirect business revenues
 - Direct and indirect job creation/retention
 - Direct and indirect payroll/household income
 - Direct tax/fiscal revenue benefits
 - Types of jobs and range of compensation (as information is made available by businesses)
 - Workers trained, as data is made available from partnering organizations)
- Monthly CWEDA Board Meetings CWEDA will provide the following for the monthly Board Meetings:
 - Agendas posted on the web site and sent out no later than three (3) days before the scheduled board meeting, including any packet materials
 - Minutes from the prior meeting presented for approval at the meeting
 - Payables for Board approval
 - Annual Budget the upcoming year's budget presented in draft at the October meeting and for approval at the November meeting
 - Provide quarterly financial updates
- Deliverables All deliverable items should be reported to cities and port by the 30th of the month following in which they are due

2. Compensation

<u>Payment Schedule</u>. CWEDA will submit to the City, in a form approved by the City, an invoice of services during each quarter. The City shall make payment to CWEDA within 30 days of receipt of each invoice. Compensation amounts shall be pursuant to the Inter Local Agreement (ILA) between the cities of Camas and Washougal, Port of Camas-Washougal, and CWEDA.

- **3. Term.** The parties intend the term of this agreement to be automatically renewable on an annual basis subject to the terms of the three party ILA. However, either party may terminate this Agreement consistent with terms of the ILA between the Port of Camas Washougal and the cities of Camas and Washougal.
- 4. General Considerations. CWEDA will keep the City advised as to the status and progress of all matters pertinent to the City. CWEDA related files on City matters will be open for inspection by the City at any reasonable time. However, all confidential, trade secret, or other materials governed by Nondisclosure Agreements/legally deemed "non-public" will remain outside the public domain. Likewise, the City will make every effort to inform CWEDA on matters relating to business development, including but not limited to proposed and adopted Comprehensive Plan changes, land use matters, municipal codes, taxes and fees, and any other matter that may hinder or enhance CWEDA's ability to fulfill its duties and responsibilities. CWEDA will make every effort to handle City matters promptly and efficiently according to established legal and ethical standards. The City will respect the governing bylaws, partner agreements, governing board policies, and board to staff/contractor relationships. It is understood that the CWEDA Executive Committee may meet at its discretion, with or without City or Port officials, to discuss CWEDA matters, and that it may be desirable that the President/CEO of CWEDA not be in attendance. In the event such a meeting is to be held, in the interest of good communication, the President/CEO of CWEDA will receive a courtesy notice that such a meeting will occur (with a minimum three day notice, unless circumstances require shorter notice).

~ PROCLAMATION ~

WHEREAS, Community Development Week is the time of year where we highlight the impact the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and the HOME Investment Partnerships Program have in our communities; and

WHEREAS, The CDBG Program has considerable flexibility to allow communities to carry out activities that are tailored to their unique housing, community and neighborhood revitalization needs; and

WHEREAS, in Clark County, CDBG funding of over \$60 million dollars since 1975, and HOME funding of over \$24 million since 1992, has provided affordable housing and housing rehabilitation; neighborhood revitalization; human service needs; construction or expansion of community facilities and shelters; and physical redevelopment throughout the county; and

WHEREAS, the City of Camas, Washington and other local governments have clearly demonstrated the capacity to administer and customize the CDBG program to identify and resolve pressing local problems, such as neighborhood infrastructure and social service needs, job creation and retention, and affordable housing;
