IX. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

A. Council Consideration of a Plat Alteration Application Submitted by Ecological Land Services on Behalf of Roy and Lisa Archilla

1. Details: Plat Alteration of the rear property line for Lot 61, Lakeridge Subdivision into Tract "C" of the Lakeridge Subdivision for the purposes of resolving an encroachment of a water feature onto property owned by the City of Camas. The adjustment would involve approximately 170 to 350 square feet of area. The site is located at 807 NW 35th Avenue on the north side of NW 35th near the intersection of NW 35th and NW Lacamas Lane; Clark County Assessor No. 124817-382. All property owners within the Lakeridge Subdivision were notified of the Plat Alteration request and provided a 14-day opportunity to request a public hearing on this matter in accordance with RCW 58.17.215. No request for a hearing was submitted. Council will need to decide whether to approve Figure 2, Option 1 or Figure 3, Option 2 of the submitted Plat Alteration request together with the following conditions, as a resolution to the Civil Regulatory Order (CV13-01):

Acquisition of City Property

The property to be acquired from the City shall be purchased at fair market value based upon an appraisal prepared by a mutually agreed upon appraiser.

Remediation/Replanting

The applicant shall replant and remediate, in accordance with the recommendations of a letter dated September 25, 2013, from Ecological Land Services, Inc., those portions of the City property identified under CR013-01 that are not being purchased under the Plat Alteration. All plantings/remediation shall be completed by May 2014.

A cash bond in the amount of 110% of the estimated value of the planting shall be submitted to the City to assure survival of the plantings for a period of three years.

Recording of Plat Alteration

Three mylar copies shall be submitted to the City for applicable signatures. One copy of the recorded plat shall be returned to the City of Camas Public Works Department. An electronic copy of the revised plat shall be submitted in a format acceptable to the City Engineer.

Details: This resolution sets a 10-minute parking time limit for one space on NE 6th Avenue in front of the apartments at 615 NE 6th Avenue, one space on NE Birch Street between NE 3rd Avenue and NE 4th Avenue near Cafe´ Piccolo Paradiso, and a second space on NE Cedar Street between NE 4th Avenue and NE 5th Avenue. This resolution also changes the current 6-hour parking spaces on NE Cedar Street and NE Birch Street between NE 5th Avenue and NE 6th Avenue to unrestricted time limits.

The 2014 Budget also includes \$25.8 million in capital projects and incorporates utility rate increases. In addition, the 2014 Budget maintains a reserve of 20% which is above the 17% fund balance policy.

IV. COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

A. 2013 Downtown Parking Change Requests

Details: Staff has considered in more detail the downtown parking change requests that were submitted within the last year and presented to Council in September. The following requests for parking changes were submitted: C-TRAN/chauffeur pick-up spot in front of the apartments at 615 NE 6th Avenue; Liberty Theatre owner request for three-hour parking downtown or more six-hour spots; 10-minute spot for Cafe´ Piccolo Paradiso; relocate existing handicap space to the front of Dr. Bryan Harris' office; and the Downtown Camas Association (DCA) Program Coordinator request to change some existing two-hour parking spaces on NE 5th Avenue to three-hour spaces. A map to illustrate the areas of these requests is attached and was displayed. Staff recommended one 10-minute space designation on NE 6th Avenue. Staff did not have a

recommendation on either request for additional parking spaces in excess of two hours. Staff finds that the 10-minute space in front of Cafe´ Piccolo Paradiso is feasible but had no recommendation. Staff discussed a few options Council had regarding Dr. Harris' request for a handicap space. Each person requesting a parking change was notified of this November 4th Work Session item.

After Council discussion, it was decided that a resolution will be included during the November 18th Regular Meeting. Included in the resolution will be a ten-minute space in front of 615 NE 6th Avenue, a ten-minute space in front of Café Piccolo Paradiso, an additional ten-minute space near the liquor store and Happy Island Restaurant and the removal of the six-hour parking restrictions on Cedar and Birch Streets.

Council directed staff to poll the business owners on NE 5th Avenue regarding changing the two hour parking spaces to three hours—the only three hour parking spaces that are being considered at this time. G. Project S-583 NW 18th Avenue Bike and Pedestrian Trail Link Professional Services Contract

Details: The City received \$220,000 in federal grant money to install a bicycle and pedestrian link on NW 18th Avenue from SE 201st Street to NW Beech Street. Harper Houf Peterson Righellis Inc. has been selected for the design and for the preparation of the environmental and public information work. This work has been estimated at \$65,000.

CH2M HILL has reviewed the bids that were submitted on November 7, 2013 for the WS-709D Water Transmission Main Project. The WS-709D Water Transmission Main Project will construct approximately 14,892 feet of 12-inch ductile iron water transmission main and approximately 2,877 feet of 18-inch ductile iron water transmission main in SR 500, NE 9th Street, NE 277th Avenue, NE Blair Road, NE Reilly Road and NE 292nd Avenue. The project also includes construction of a prefabricated pressure reducing station, air relief valve vaults, hydrant assemblies, connections to existing City of Camas piping, traffic control, temporary patching, repaving, erosion control, and other items as stated or shown in the project plans and specifications.

The project was advertised on October 3, 2013. A total of five addenda were issued prior to the bid opening on November 7, 2013. The City of Camas received a total of 8 bids ranging from \$2,311,765.37 to \$3,286,502.47. The revised Engineer's Estimate was \$3,093,591. The table below lists the bidders and their bid total.

In review of the unit prices in the bids, the unit prices in the bid by Rotschy, Inc. appear reasonable when compared to the prices bid by the next three lowest bidders and were substantially lower than the Engineer's estimate. The bids received match CH2M HILL's bidding experience for the last two years. There is substantial competitive pressure affecting materials prices, contingencies, and contractor overhead and profit that result in the low bidder often coming in substantially below the engineer's estimate. In addition, the following items are of note:

- The unit prices submitted for mobilization ranged between \$71,200 and \$300,000 with the low bidder submitting a mobilization cost of \$141,490.68, which seems reasonable.
- The unit prices submitted for traffic control ranged in price between \$55,000 and \$180,000, with the low bidder submitting a total traffic control cost of \$55,000. The low bidder's unit price for traffic control was the lowest received, so it will be important to review traffic control requirements with the contractor during the preconstruction conference and to make sure that the contractor conforms to the requirements of Washington DOT and Clark County.
- Costs submitted by the bidders were comparable for all of the other bid items.
- The low bidder submitted a unit cost of \$75 per lineal foot of installed restrained 12-inch ductile iron pipe (Class 52) and \$110 per lineal foot of installed restrained 18-inch ductile iron pipe (Class 52) which are very cost-competitive prices for pipe.

In summary, it is our recommendation that as the responsive, low-bidder Rotschy, Inc. should be awarded the construction contract for the WS-709D Water Transmission Main Project. Please let me know if you have any questions.

Ecological Land Services, Inc. has been contracted by the Archilla family (applicant) to create and propose a plat alteration for their property located at 807 NW 35th Avenue (Clark County Tax Parcel Number 124817382). At the request of City Council, the following is a plan for replanting of the City's property where lawn encroaches, and a proposal for a plat alteration to allow retention of the hardscape water feature located partially on City property (Clark County Tax Parcel Number 124817394).

Proposed Replanting

The City's property is zoned Open Space and is 5.88 acres of undeveloped forest, with a contiguous 1.71-acre Open Space parcel to the west. Surrounding land use is residential and the connection of the open space parcels with habitat associated with Lacamas Lake to the north is disrupted by NW 44th Avenue and NW Lacamas Lane. Because of this close association with Lacamas Lake, only native vegetation will be used in the site replanting.

Underground irrigation plumbing and maintained lawn, installed prior to the applicant's ownership of the property, will be removed from the city's property. The lawn area and the adjacent landscaped slope will be replanted with dense native shrubs.

Replanting in the reclaimed lawn and slope area will include native ferns and shrubs installed at a spacing of 4 feet on center. Dense planting will help to inhibit the growth of invasive and weedy species, thus minimizing the need for maintenance to ensure plant health. Native species planned for use on site include black twinberry (Lonicera involucrata), baldhip rose (Rosa gymnocarpa), salmonberry (Rubus spectabilis), Oregon grape (Mahonia aquifolium), and sword fern (Polystichum munitum). A total of approximately 60 to 70 shrubs will be installed in the reclaimed City property.

Proposed Plat Alteration

In the absence of an official property survey for this preliminary proposal and with the inherent inaccuracy of GIS due to scaling on aerial photography, ELS corrected the property lines of the Archilla property and City property from those shown on Clark County GIS based on aerial photography and a site visit by City staff (Figure 1). Two options for plat alteration have been prepared for your consideration. Following selection of the preferred option, the area will need to be surveyed for appraisal and the areas are likely to change from this preliminary estimate.

Option 1 follows the footprint of the existing water feature for minimal land area exchange to accomplish the goal of hardscape retention (Figure 2). This option adds approximately 170 square feet to the Archilla property and replants approximately 1,045 square feet of City property (Table 1).

Option 2 straightens the lot line for a simpler and less sudden transition between the properties at the edge of the hardscape (Figure 3). This option adds approximately 330 square feet to the Archilla property and replants approximately 980 square feet of City property. This option is preferred by the applicant.

Dear Phil-

Although we are not directly affected by this water feature encroachment onto City of Camas property, we feel the need to comment and request that this plat alteration be declined.

The reasons are as follows:

- 1. The water feature is a clear encroachment onto City property.
- 2. Prior to construction, the rear property line should have been determined, and any encroachment onto City property, the owners should have requested the City's permission.
- 3. We are aware of at least one requested City variance which entailed minimum set back requirements that the City of Camas denied; this was Lot 59.
- 4. If approved, what message is sent to the other Lot Owners in Lakeridge with rear City owned Green Belt land? How many other Lot Owners will request an extension of their property onto the Green Belt property?
- 5. Several Lot Owners had to spend considerable dollars to rectify violations of Lakeridge CC&Rs. Even though a different issue, a financial precedent has been established for Lot Owners to comply with rules and regulations of Lakeridge. There should be no difference in complying with Platted Lot dimensions.
- 6. One of the considerations for purchasing our house was we knew exactly where ours, and our neighbor's rear property line was, and any future extension of their rear property onto the City Owned Green Belt property would have been a possible infringement on our privacy. We would have objected to any such extension of our neighbors rear property lot line.
- 7. During construction of the house we purchased, we requested the builder to extend our rear deck an additional three feet, and we were informed that would not comply with the rear property line setback requirements. We, and the builder, never even considered asking for a Plat variance from the City. The lot had minimum setback requirements, and we needed to be in compliance, period.

RESOLUTION NO. 1281

A RESOLUTION establishing a ten minute time limit for one parking space on North East 6th Avenue between Everett Street and Franklin Street, an additional space on North East Cedar Street between 4th Avenue and 5th Avenue, and one parking space on North East Birch Street between 3rd Avenue and 4th Avenue; and removing the six hour time limits on NE Cedar Street and North East Birch Street between 5th Avenue and 6th Avenue.

WHEREAS, CMC10.08.010, allows the City Council from time to time to impose parking time limits for designated streets and locations within the city; and

WHEREAS, the parking time limits for North East 6th Avenue between Everett Street and Franklin Street are currently seventy-two hours, and

WHEREAS, the parking time limits for North East Cedar Street between 4th Avenue and 5th Avenue are currently two hours with the exception of one 10 minute space; and

WHEREAS, the parking time limits on North East Birch Street between 3rd Avenue and 4th Avenue are currently two hours; and

WHEREAS, the parking time limits for the west side of North East Cedar Street between 5^{th} Avenue and 6^{th} Avenue are currently six hours, with the exception of one 30 minute space; and

WHEREAS, the parking time limits for either side of North East Birch Street between 5^{th} . Avenue and 6^{th} Avenue are currently six hours; and

WHEREAS, the Council desires to impose a ten minute parking time limit for three spaces and eliminate the six hour parking time limits on North East Cedar Street and North East Birch Street; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMAS AS FOLLOWS:

Section I

The parking time limit shall be ten minutes for one space on the north side of North East 6th Avenue between Everett Street and Franklin Street adjacent to 615 North East Everett Street, for one space on the west side of North East Birch Street between North East 3rd Avenue and North East 4th Avenue, and a second space on North East Cedar Street between 4th Avenue and 5th Avenue.

Section II

The parking time limits for all of the existing six hour parking spaces on North East Cedar Street and North East Birch Street between 5^{th} Avenue and 6^{th} Avenue shall be unrestricted.

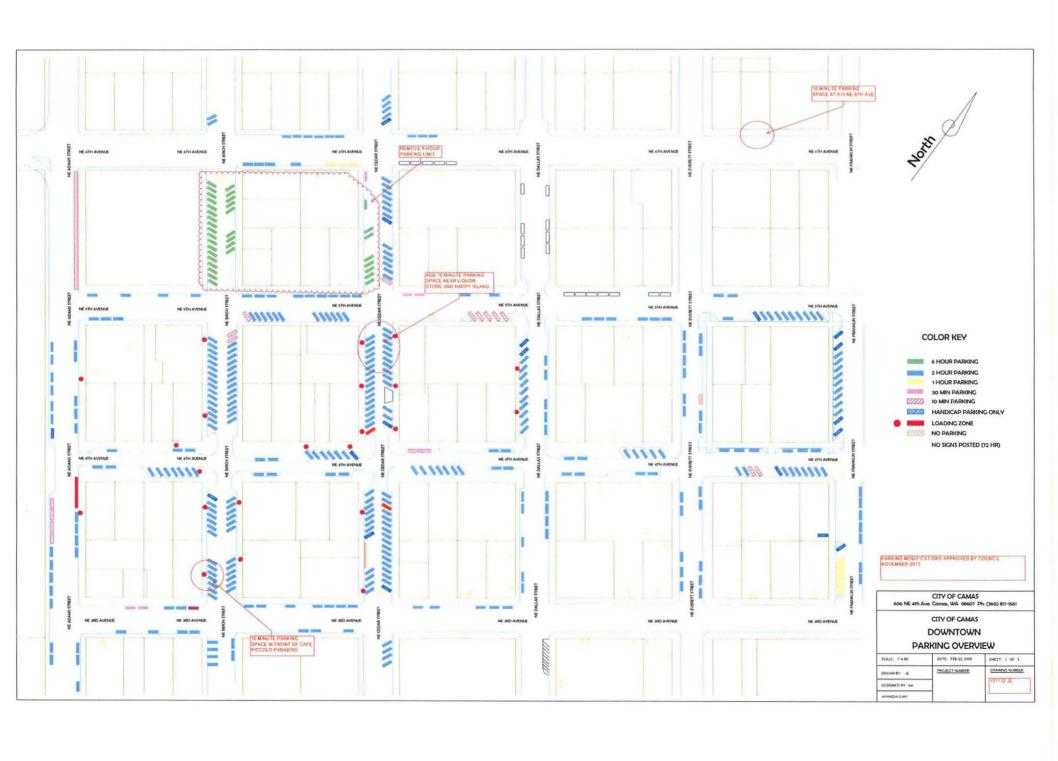

ORDINANCE NO. 2680

AN ORDINANCE adopting revisions to the Camas Comprehensive Plan Map and the City of Camas Zoning Map and adopting the Comprehensive Stormwater Drainage Plan.

WHEREAS, the City of Camas has heretofore adopted a Comprehensive Plan and Comprehensive Land Use Map as required by the provisions of RCW 36.70A, Revised Code of Washington, the Growth Management Act, and

WHEREAS, under Chapter 36.70A, Revised Code of Washington, the City is required annually to consider amendments to the land use element of the Comprehensive Plan and associated rezones, and

WHEREAS, the Planning Commission has conducted a public hearing on the requests for revisions submitted to the City, and has forwarded its recommendation to the City Council, and

WHEREAS, the City Council has conducted a public hearing on the requests for revisions,

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CAMAS DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section I

A request from property owners, Daley, MacDonald & Mackay, proposed to change the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning designation for three contiguous parcels, located north of NW 18th Avenue and west of NW Brady Road, with a combined 28.19 acres. The request is to amend the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning from Light Industrial/Business Park (LI/BP) to a Comprehensive Plan designation of Industrial with an associated Zoning of Business Park (BP). The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of Planning Commission, and directs the Community Development Director to amend the Camas Comprehensive Plan map to designate the 28.19 acres as Industrial. The Community Development Director is further directed to amend the Camas Zoning map to designate the 28.19 acres as Business Park.

Section II

A request from eleven property owners, collectively known as Lacamas Northshore, to change the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Designation of their contiguous 20 parcels, which are located north of Lacamas Lake to the northern and eastern city limits, for a combined 460 acres (refer to Table 1). The request is to amend the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning from Light

Section III

The City requests to amend the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning designations for the area known as the North Dwyer Creek Master Plan, which is generally bounded by NW Lake Road, NW Friberg Street, NE Goodwin Road, and Lacamas Creek, with a combined 688 acres. The request is to amend the Comprehensive Plan designations of 157.73 acres from LI/BP and Single-family Medium to Industrial, Multi-family High, and Single-family Low with associated zoning of Business Park (BP), Multi-family 18,000 (MF-18), and Residential 15,000 (R-15). The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of Planning Commission, and directs the Community Development Director to amend the Camas Comprehensive Plan map to designate the properties as illustrated on Exhibit B as follows: Industrial for 92.61 acres; Multi-family High for 44.23 acres; and Single-family Low for 20.89 acres. The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of the Planning Commission, and directs the Community Development Director to amend the Camas Zoning map as described in Table 1 as follows: Business Park (BP) for 92.61 acres, Multi-family 18 (MF-18) for 44.23 acres, and Residential 15,000 (R-15) for 20.89 acres.

Section IV

The City requests to amend the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning designation for two parcels, known as the Rose Property, which is bounded on three sides by the Lacamas Northshore area, for a combined 54 acres (refer to Table 1). The proposal is to amend the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning of LI/BP to Comprehensive Plan designations of Commercial and Single-Family Medium. The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of Planning Commission, and directs the Community Development Director to amend the Camas Comprehensive Plan map to designate 10 acres as Commercial and the remainder of the combined parcels as Single-family Medium. The Community Development Director is further directed to amend the Camas Zoning Map to designate 10 acres as Community Commercial (CC) and the remainder of the combined parcels as Residential-12,000 (R-12).

Section V

The proposal includes multiple amendments to correct inadvertent errors found on the current Camas Comprehensive Plan map and Camas Zoning map, as follows:

- A. Open space designated land at the Lake Hills property (parcel #84840-000) to be amended based on a recorded survey.
- B. Comprehensive plan and zoning designation of City-owned property along NW Parker Street (parcels #177696-000 and #986028-114), to be amended from LL/BP to Open Space.
- C. Comprehensive plan designation of City-owned property, within the UGB and adjacent to Lacamas Lake (parcel #178099-000), to be amended from Single-family Low to Open Space.
- D. Mixed use overlay area within North Dwyer Creek to be amended from Comprehensive Plan designation of LI/BP to Multi-family High, to match the existing zoning overlay.

The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of the Planning Commission and directs the Community Development Director to amend the Comprehensive Land Use Map and Zoning Map of the City of Camas to correct the inadvertent errors as noted herein.

Section VI

The proposal includes an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan, by adopting the Comprehensive Stormwater Drainage Plan (dated April 2013), attached as Exhibit C. The plan provides strategies for stormwater treatment, identifies improvement projects and associated costs, and will provide necessary documentation of planned projects to meet grant application requirements. The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of the Planning Commission to amend the Comprehensive Plan by including the Comprehensive Storm Drainage Plan.

Section VII

The City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of the Planning Commission and directs the Community Development Director to amend the Camas Comprehensive Plan map and City of Camas Zoning map as described in Sections I through V of this Ordinance, Table 1, and attached as Exhibits D (Camas Comprehensive Plan map) and E (Camas Zoning map). Further, the City Council hereby adopts the recommendation of the Planning Commission to amend the Comprehensive Plan by including the Comprehensive Stormwater Drainage Plan as attached Exhibit C.

Section VIII

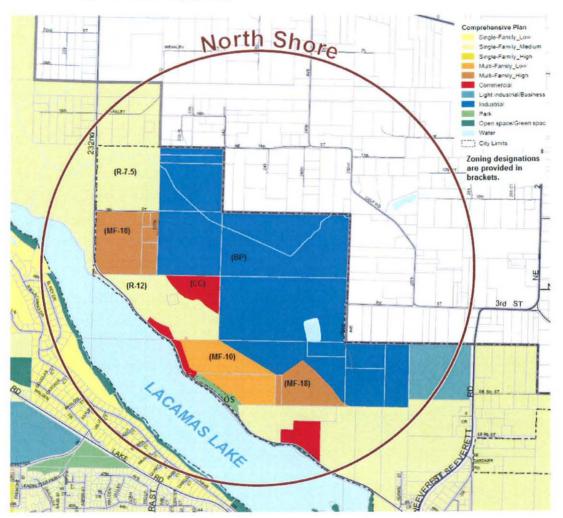
