Formal "Acceptance" of the project had been delayed pending receipt of certain project information. This information has now been received.

This Agreement provides terms by which the City of Camas will accept the roadway right-of-way from Clark County. Clark County will repave Goodwin Road in 2013 and will inspect the Lacamas Creek Bridge until 2018. Camas will pay Clark County to maintain the traffic signal at NE 13th Street and Friberg/Strunk under the current interlocal agreement between the two agencies.
- F. Authorize the Mayor to sign the Quit Claim Deed with Clark County for the transfer of ownership to the City of Camas of NE Goodwin Road Right-of-Way. The terminus points of this conveyance are 350 feet west of Friberg/Strunk Street and the existing west city limits near the Lacamas Lake Bridge.
- G. Authorize the Mayor to sign the interlocal agreement between the City of Camas and the Cowlitz-Wahkiakum Council of Governments (CWCOG), allowing the City to join

the Kaiser medical insurance rate stabilization pool created by the CWCOG. This interlocal was discussed at the November 5, 2012, Council Workshop.

- H. Authorize the Mayor to sign the First Amendment to the Timberland Purchase and Sale Agreement with Longview Fiber for Project No. WS-709 Surface Water Headworks Study. This amendment extends the closing date to allow time to complete the County land use process and to set the final sale price at \$30,000 based on the appraised value. ROAD AND RIGHT OF WAY CONVEYANCE AGREEMENT

This Agreement effective the 1st day January, 2013 by and between Clark County, Washington (Department of Public Works), hereinafter referred to as the "County" and the City of Camas, Washington, hereinafter referred to as the "City", collectively hereinafter the "Parties".

WHEREAS, the City is planning the improvement of a section of Goodwin Road, presently owned and maintained by the County, hereinafter referred to as the "Project"; and

WHEREAS, the City has secured financing and is now designing improvements to the above county road with the intention to incorporate said road into the city street system; and

WHEREAS, construction of the project will require the County to transfer to the City ownership and responsibilities for maintenance and operation of certain right of way and roadway facilities, as shown on Exhibit "A", attached hereto and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the County and City enter into this Agreement to identify the process of transferring ownership and responsibilities for the maintenance and operation of the roadway facilities and right of way indicated on Exhibit "A".

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS AGREED between the parties as follows:

- 1. Completion, Acceptance and Transfer of Operation and Maintenance
 - 1.1 The City agrees to accept ownership of the right of way and roadway facilities as shaded, where applicable, on Exhibit "A", as follows:

Light Blue indicates roadway facilities and right of way to be conveyed in fee to the City; and

Yellow indicates easements to be conveyed to the City.

- 1.2 The City agrees to take ownership of the signal at the intersection of NW Friberg-Strunk Street (NE 202nd Avenue) and Goodwin Road.
- 1.3 The County agrees to the following:
 - A. Continue to inspect the Lacamas Creek Bridge until 2018, at County cost.
 - B. Maintain the new signal at the intersection of NW Friberg-Strunk Street (NE 202nd Avenue) and Goodwin Road per existing agreements with the City. The County may salvage equipment from the existing signal when it is replaced.

- C. Support regional transportation planning in the area and make best efforts to see that TIF and other applicable funding sources are allocated to future regional roadway improvements for Goodwin Road.
- D. Overlay Goodwin Road in 2013.
- 2. Recorded Conveyance
 - 2.1 Within two (2) months following the County's written transfer to the City of the responsibility for maintenance and operations as provided in Section 1, the County will furnish the City with a recordable conveyance of right of way, including the roadway facilities constructed thereon, as shown on the plans marked as Exhibit "A". The City agrees to see that the conveyance is recorded, pursuant to RCW 65.08.095.
 - 2.2 The City agrees to comply with, and require its successors or assigns to comply with, all civil rights and anti-discrimination requirements of Chapter 49.60 RCW, as to the right of way and roadway facilities to be conveyed.
 - 2.3 The City, on behalf of itself and its heirs, successors or assigns, waives and/or releases the County from any past, present, or future claims for damages directly or indirectly caused by highway drainage or runoff, and further the City, its heirs, successors or assigns, shall have no right of compensation for damages to the property herein conveyed caused directly or indirectly by highway drainage or runoff.

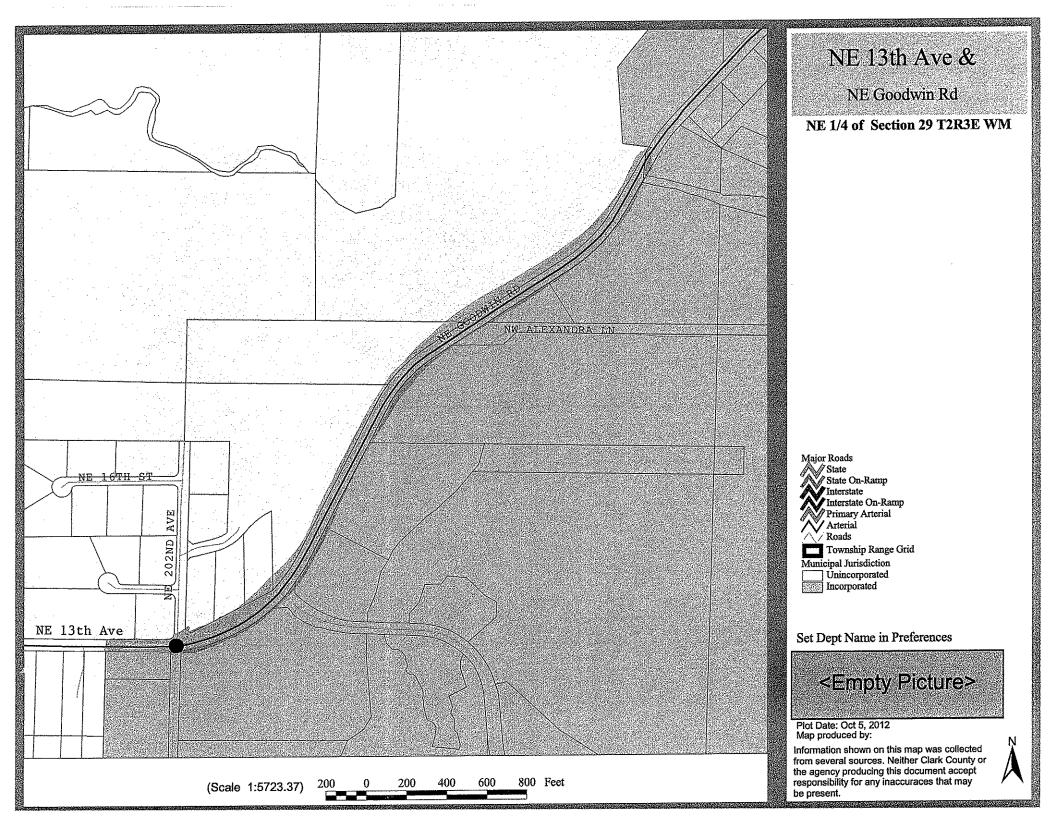

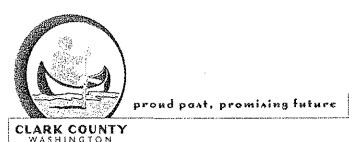

Interlocal Agreement CWCOG Medical Insurance Rate Stabilization Pool

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 39.34, Revised Code of Washington (RCW), permits local governments in Washington State to develop and implement interlocal agreements regarding issues of common interest and concern;

WHEREAS, the CWCOG is an association of local governments and other agencies formed pursuant to Chapter 36.64.080 RCW, for the purposes of addressing issues of interest and concern that cross jurisdictional boundaries; it's membership includes county, city and special purpose district governments, a public community college, and a variety of non-profit agencies;

WHEREAS, the CWCOG's functions are to serve its members by providing a regional forum to address issues of mutual interest and concern, develop recommendations and provide a wide variety of technical and contractual services. The CWCOG's mission is to efficiently utilize resources so as to yield long-term benefits that enhance the quality of life for our communities and region;

WHEREAS, the CWCOG membership are experiencing unprecedented demands to provide services to their citizens and constituents with financial resources that are severely constrained if not reduced;

WHEREAS, the CWCOG members individually participate in a variety of medical insurance programs and each participates by varying degrees in wellness programs and all share experience and significant concerns for the impact medical insurance premiums are having on highly constrained financial resources;

WHEREAS, the CWCOG members recognize that, in order to provide health insurance for employees as economically as possible, jointly participating in a risk pool based on the combined size of all groups would achieve improved economies of scale while improving opportunities for broader based wellness initiatives and improved health behaviors resulting in significant benefits for both the employers and employees;

WHEREAS, to accomplish this requires CWCOG members to jointly participate in a health risk management program designed to manage risk and promote wellness;

WHEREAS, pooling will be for the purpose of setting future rate actions (be they increases, no change, or decreases), not for establishing specific rates on specific groups. The CWCOG agrees it would not be purchasing or entering into insurance contracts on behalf of participating entities;

WHEREAS, the pooling concept would not require that members change current levels of benefits offered or plan designs available to employees through carriers underwriting plans for the Pool and group agreements with participating carriers will be entered into by and between participating members and carriers just as they would outside of the Pool; WHEREAS, the two most significant advantages of having smaller sized groups pool together as one large group is in the resulting lower administrative costs which are characterized as retention charges and having greater stability in the rating.

NOW, THEREFORE, the below signatories agree to participate in the Cowlitz-Wahkiakum Council of Governments Medical Insurance Rate Stabilization Pool, with the following provisions:

- 1. Pooling will be for the purpose of setting future rate actions (increases, no change, decreases), not for establishing specific rates on specific groups or negotiating any specific plan offerings. The CWCOG would not be purchasing or entering into insurance contracts on behalf of participating entities.
- 2. Any plan changes must be coordinated with the renewal(s) of the pool and incorporated into the underwritten rate action. There will be no more than three set renewal periods, to fall on or about January, July and/or October of each year.
- 3. The signatories to this agreement may have special districts and other organizations for which health care benefits are administered according to other agreements; as such, these jurisdictions and organizations are included in this agreement and likewise agree to participate.
- 4. Going into the pool, groups will be evaluated to ensure their plan rates are adequate for their risk; individual adjustments to the pooled adjustments may be necessary to get groups to an adequate level of funding in the initial year(s) of the program.
- 5. Each individual group entering the Risk Pool will be rated upon their own merit (i.e. experience, demographics and risk as appropriate for their currently enrolled size).
- 6. Calculations for the first and subsequent CWCOG Risk Pool renewals will be based upon the combined size, experience, demographics and risk of the entire pool.
- 7. Participating entities will be responsible for providing demographic/census information on a timely basis as may be required by the Pool and or insurance carriers.
- 8. Eligible entities agree to promote and administer at least the "core set" of Health and Wellness programs established by the CWCOG Risk Pool participants. The CWCOG will be responsible for a good faith effort to ensure these entities follow through on this commitment.
- 9. In the initial years of the program, concentration will be given by participating entities to promote employee participation in health risk assessments and biometric testing. Results will be used by CWCOG Risk Pool participants to help guide communication strategies that address areas of risk within the respective populations and establish the aforementioned "core set" of Health and Wellness programs.

- 10. A standing committee will be established to address health trends and wellness programs, review experience and related common interests, address other human resource topics related to health care and wellness, and address any responsibilities for administration of this Agreement. Each party will have one voting member on such committee. There is no separate legal or administrative entity created by this Agreement.
- 11. Participating entities agree to provide 180 days written notice to the CWCOG prior to withdrawal from the Agreement. Entities that decide to withdraw from the pool cannot rejoin any sooner than two years from the date of withdrawal.
- 12. It is not contemplated that there will be any jointly-owned property in the administration of this Agreement and thus no method is necessary to dispose of property upon partial or complete termination of this Agreement.
- 13. Interwest Benefit Consultants, Inc. located in Longview, Washington, shall be appointed as broker of record by participating CWCOG members, individually or collectively, for all associated lines of insurance coverage that utilize the CWCOG Risk Pool for underwriting purposes. Said appointment will be effective on the first day of coverage of the respective plan year or written policy and will continue throughout participation in the pool. Interwest Benefits Consultants, Inc. will provide services to pool participants that include but are not limited to assisting in the development and management of employee benefit programs, facilitate the renewal process and work as a liaison with the insurance carriers regarding plan design, underwriting, and pricing. Interwest Benefit Consultants will serve as the Pool's advocate and advisor in dealing with insurance companies and administrators to resolve issues involving claims, service, and regulations as well as assisting employers in communicating benefit packages to their employees.
- 14. Each party shall be liable and responsible for the consequences of any negligent or wrongful act or failure to act on the part of itself and its officers, employees and agents. No parties assume responsibility to any other party for the consequences of any act or omission of any person, firm or corporation not a part of this Agreement. Each party agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the other parties, its officers, employees and agents from any and all claims, actions, costs, damages and expenses of any nature arising out of or in conjunction with any act authorized by this Agreement.
- 15. Funding for the provisions herein shall be as provided each year in the respective budgets of each party to this Agreement.
- 16. Neither the parties to this Agreement nor the CWCOG shall assign, transfer, or encumber any rights, obligations, duties, or interests accruing or arising from this Agreement without the express prior written consent of the other. Subject to the foregoing, the Agreement will be binding upon, enforceable by, and inure to the benefit of, the parties and their successors and assigns.
- 17. Executed copies of this Agreement shall be filed by CWCOG as required by section 39.34.040 Revised Code of Washington prior to this Agreement becoming effective.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. Governing Law. The Agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of Washington and its choice of law rules. The parties irrevocably consents to the exclusive personal jurisdiction and venue of the federal and state courts located in Cowlitz County, Washington or the applicable federal court for such County, with respect to any dispute arising out of or in connection with the Agreement, and agrees not to commence or prosecute any action or proceeding arising out of or in connection with the Agreement other than in the aforementioned courts.
- 2. Severability. If any provision of the Agreement is held to be invalid or unenforceable for any reason, the remaining provisions will continue in full force without being impaired or invalidated in any way. The parties agree to replace any invalid provision with a valid provision that most closely approximates the intent and economic effect of the invalid provision.
- **3.** Non-waiver. Any failure by the parties to enforce strict performance of any provision of the Agreement will not constitute a waiver of the parties' right to subsequently enforce such provision or any other provision of the Agreement.
- 4. Notices. All notices and other communications required under the Agreement must be in writing, and must be given by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, or delivered by hand to the party to whom the communication is to be given, at its address as follows: CWCOG, 207 Fourth Avenue No., Kelso, WA 98626.
- 5. Legal Fees. In any lawsuit between the parties with respect to the matters covered by the Agreement, the prevailing party will be entitled to receive its reasonable attorney's fees and costs incurred in the lawsuit, in addition to any other relief it may be awarded.
- 6. Counterparts. The Agreement may be signed in counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, and all of which, taken together, shall be deemed one and the same document.
- 7. Captions. The captions in this Agreement are for convenience only and do not in any way limit or amplify particular provisions.
- 8. Modifications or Amendments. This Agreement, together with attachments or addenda, represents the entire and integrated Agreement between the parties hereto and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations, or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may be amended, modified, or added to only by written instrument properly signed by all parties hereto.

This Agreement shall commence on January 1, 2013, and continue until December 31, 2013, and automatically renew on a year-to-year basis thereafter unless terminated by each and any parties to this Agreement by giving notice to CWCOG as provided herein.

CONTRACT FOR SERVICES

SAFETY AND COMPLIANCE PROGAM

The Northwest Regional Training Center (Training Center), under the direction of Clark County Fire District 5, and the City of Camas (City) hereby agree to the following program for calendar year 2013.

- A. Services to be Provided The Training Center shall provide safety training to City employees as follows:
 - <u>Classroom Instruction and Training</u> The Training Center will make available to City employees classroom instruction and training in all OSHA and WISHA required areas, as outlined in Appendix B. This training may occur at the Training Center facilities or at another site designated by the City, as agreed upon by the Safety Program Manager and the City.
 - <u>Maintenance of all Training Records</u> The Training Center will maintain a database of all training that is conducted for the City. Reports showing all training conducted year-to-date will be provided to the City monthly.
 - Notification and Scheduling of Training Classes The Training Center will
 provide the City with notification of classes to be conducted. This information will
 be provided by the fifteenth of the month prior to the upcoming quarter. For
 example, the City will be notified by March 15 of classes to be provided during
 April, May, and June.
 - Assistance with Labor and Industries Audits Training Center personnel will be available to assist the City with all records and information associated with training conducted by the Training Center. This will include copies of class rosters, training curriculum, and competency records (if needed).
- B. Responsibilities of the City The City shall be responsible for the following:
 - 1. <u>Listing of Employees by Division</u> The City shall provide the Training Center with a roster of employees who will need training, broken down by division.
 - Assistance in Determining Required Training The City shall work with the Safety Program Manager in determining what type of training is needed for personnel in each division.
 - Notification of Intent to Attend Classes At least 7 calendar days prior to a class being conducted, the City shall notify the Training Center of their intent to have employees participate, and if so, the number who will be participating.
 - 4. <u>Promptly Pay Training Center Invoices</u> Appendix A includes the annual 2013 charges which the City is agreeing to pay. The Training Center will bill the City in the months of January, April, July, and October. These billings will be for the current guarter, and will be due upon receipt.

C. Additional Training

The classes provided under this agreement are listed in Appendix B. The City may participate in other classes offered by the Training Center, however, they will pay the same rate for such classes as other customers.

D. Annual Meeting

During September the Training Center shall schedule a meeting with the City during which time the parties will discuss the following: (a) Services provided and received and any associated problems, (b) The next year's budget as established by the Training Center for Safety Training costs, and (c) Desirability by both parties to continue with the Safety Training program.

- E. Liability Each party agrees to assume responsibility for all liabilities that occur or arise in any way out of the performance of this agreement by its personnel and to save and hold the other parties, including their respective employees and officials, harmless from all costs, expenses, losses and damages, including the cost of defense, incurred as a result of any acts or omissions of the parties' employees relating to the performance of this agreement.
- F. Modification of This Agreement This agreement may be modified only with the consent of both parties. To that end, the Training Center shall convene no less than one meeting each calendar year in order to solicit feedback from the City on how services could be modified and/or improved.
- G. Termination of This Agreement Either party may terminate their participation in this agreement by providing 120 days' notice of their intent to withdraw. In the event the Training Center is unable to provide services as outlined in this agreement, the City shall be reimbursed for any services paid for but not yet received.

APPENDIX A

Normal Training Charges

For 2013 the City of Camas shall pay to the Training Center a total of \$9,744.00 for normal training conducted.

This is based on an employee count of **58** employees, representing a cost of approximately **\$168.00** per employee per year for all training outlined in Appendix B.

Summer Crew Charges

In addition to the 58 regular employees covered under this contract, the City of Camas utilizes Summer Crew employees and desires to have those employees trained as well. Summer Crew employees will not be trained in all disciplines each year, but will receive training in up to five classes each summer. The City of Camas shall pay \$100 per employee for Summer Crew personnel. It is anticipated that Camas will utilize 10 Summer Crew employees during 2013. This will result in a cost of \$1,000 in addition to normal training conducted.

Total Training Charges

The sum of Normal Training and Summer Crew Training is \$10,744 for 2013. This will be billed to the City of Camas in four quarterly invoices of \$2,686.00 each.

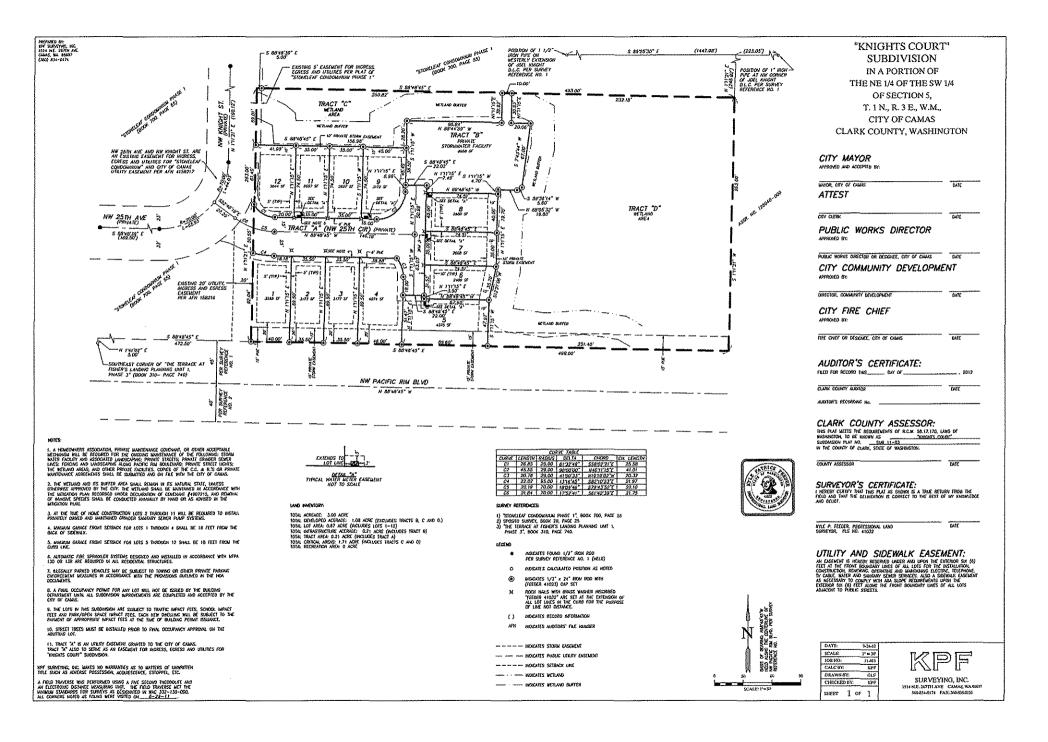

#### SERVICE AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made this day by and between EAST COUNTY FIRE and RESCUE, the CITY OF WASHOUGAL, and the CITY OF CAMAS, hereinafter referred to as "Taxing Districts",

#### <u>WITNESSETH</u>

WHEREAS, the parties hereto entered into an agreement in 2006 for the provision, funding and administration of a Washington State licensed Advanced Life Support (ALS) Emergency Medical Transport Services Program within their respective Taxing Districts, which agreement expires at the end of 2012, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to continue to provide a Washington State licensed Advanced Life Support (ALS) Emergency Medical Transport Services Program within their respective Taxing Districts, and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto desire to continue to provide for administration of said ALS Emergency Medical Care and Services Program, and

WHEREAS, each of said Taxing Districts has obtained funding for such a program by means of an Emergency Medical Care Property Tax Levy as provided for by RCW 84.52.069, and

WHEREAS, Camas renewed its levy beginning in 2013 at a new rate of forty-six cents (\$.46) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation of property, and

WHEREAS, ECFR's current levy of thirty-five cents (\$.35) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation of property expires at the end of 2014, and

WHEREAS, Washougal's current levy of fifty cents (\$.50) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation of property expires at the end of 2016, and

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WHEREAS, Camas and Washougal are engaged in a trial consolidation of complete Fire and Emergency Medical services in which the entirety of the related resources and expenditures for the consolidated department are mutually available, and

WHEREAS, Camas and Washougal are currently undertaking a Regional Fire Authority planning process which is anticipated to be concluded sometime in 2014, and

WHEREAS, it is desired to extend the current agreement for the provision, funding and administration of a Washington State licensed Advanced Life Support (ALS) Emergency Medical Transport Services Program through the end of 2014, at which time such agreement will necessarily be renewed and amended to reflect the outcome of the consolidation and Regional Fire Authority planning processes,

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and conditions herein contained, it is hereby agreed as follows"

On and after January 1, 2013through December 31, 2014the City of Camas shall furnish emergency medical rescue and licensed ALS ambulance transport service to all parties within the boundaries of the Taxing Districts, which are parties to this Service Agreement. The City of Camas shall administer this contract, including employment of personnel required to perform such ALS Emergency Medical Transport Services and provide the transportation equipment; provide EMS training as required by Washington Department of Health; and provide all supplies required for such emergency services. No new separate legal or administrative entity shall be created to administer the provisions of this agreement.

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#### Section 2. ADVISORY BOARD:

An Advisory Board is hereby created in which all Taxing Districts that are parties to this Service Agreement shall be represented by two (2) members consisting of each Taxing District's Fire Chief, or designee, and one (1) member of its legislative body. The Board shall adopt bylaws for the administration of said body, and a written copy thereof shall be provided to each Taxing District. Unless otherwise designated, all meetings of the board shall be held at the City of Camas. Regular meetings shall be held four times per year. Special meetings may be requested by any Taxing District upon timely notice to the Camas Fire Chief specifying the requested meeting date and the intended agenda for the meeting.

Said Advisory Board shall recommend and formulate written guidelines regarding fee rates, level of ambulance services, support of Taxing District medical first response programs, and for improving and coordinating said service throughout the respective districts.

### Section 3. CONTRIBUTED FUNDS:

A. In consideration of the services to be rendered by the City of Camas pursuant to this Service Agreement, each Taxing District shall pay to the City of Camas each year during the term of this Service Agreement all or a portion of the proceeds of their EMS or regular property tax levies as specifically described below. The obligation of each Taxing District is contingent on the other Taxing Districts' obtaining all necessary voter approvals for their contributions.

The City of Camas shall contribute an amount equal to the proceeds of their respective EMS levy at a rate of forty-six cents (\$0.46) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) of the assessed valuation of property in the applicable Taxing District as collected, as limited by Chap. 84.55 RCW (generally limiting annual increases in the total dollar amount of the levy to one percent, adjusted for new construction and other exceptions). East County Fire and Rescue, shall

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contribute an amount equal to a rate of thirty-five cents (\$0.35) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of the assessed valuation of property in the applicable Taxing District as collected. The City of Washougal, shall contribute an amount equal to an equivalent rate of thirty-five cents (\$0.35) per one thousand dollars (\$1,000) of the assessed valuation of property in the applicable Taxing District as collected. In the event that the agreement between Camas and Washougal for consolidation of Fire and Emergency Medical services is no longer operative, the terms of this agreement pertaining to Camas and Washougal will be renegotiated.

It is acknowledged by the parties hereto that the financial terms of this agreement will be subject to renegotiation to reflect the outcome of the Camas and Washougal Regional Fire Authority Planning Committee process.

B. East County Fire and Rescue shall make such arrangement and do such other things as may be necessary so that the Clark County Treasurer's Office shall remit all funds collected pursuant to the Emergency Medical Care and Services levies in each district directly to the City of Camas. The City of Washougal shall remit EMS levy and regular property taxes due under this agreement to the City of Camas within 10 business days after the City of Washougal's receipt of these taxes. The City of Washougal shall include with each payment to the City of Camas a copy of the remittance form received by the City of Washougal in connection with such taxes.

C. The City of Camas agrees that all funds received pursuant to this Service Agreement shall be deposited in the City of Camas Emergency Rescue Fund and shall be used only for the provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical services, including related personnel costs, training for such personnel, administrative costs, and related equipment,

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supplies, vehicles and structures needed for the provision of emergency medical care or emergency medical service.

<u>Section 4</u>. <u>OWNERSHIP OF PROPERTY</u>: All equipment and supplies purchased by the City of Camas for purposes or performing its obligations under this agreement shall be owned by the City of Camas. Upon termination of this agreement by any Taxing District, however, such equipment and supplies held by the terminating party shall be the property of and remain with the terminating party at the time of termination. In the event of dissolution of the emergency medical rescue and licensed ALS ambulance transport service created by this agreement, assets purchased by the City of Camas with Emergency Rescue funds shall be distributed consistent with a process decided by the Advisory Board and approved by the legislative bodies of each Taxing District at the time of dissolution.

Section 5. <u>RATES</u>: Notwithstanding the provisions in <u>Section 3</u> hereof requiring financial contributions from the listed Taxing Districts, the City of Camas shall be allowed to charge for services to be rendered hereunder as per the prevailing rates established by resolution adopted by the Camas City Council from time to time. Any increases or adjustments to said rates shall be reviewed and approved by a majority of the members of the afore described Advisory Board for consistency with established rate guidelines prior to adoption by Camas City Council resolution.

<u>Section 6</u>. <u>HOLD HARMLESS AND INSURANCE</u>: The City of Camas shall defend, indemnify and hold the Taxing Districts, its officers, officials, employees and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, injuries, damages, losses or suits including attorney fees arising out of or in connection with the performance of this Agreement, except for injuries and damages caused by the sole negligence of the Taxing Districts. The City of Camas further

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agrees to maintain during the term of this agreement liability insurance in an amount as provided for in the WCIA Joint Protection Program (currently \$15,000,000 maximum per claim), protecting itself, its officers and employees, and the Taxing Districts, their officers and employees, from claims of all persons for damages arising out of negligence by the City of Camas, its officers and employees, in the providing of emergency medical services pursuant to this agreement.

Section 7. <u>TERM</u>: Unless earlier terminated pursuant to Section 9, this agreement shall commence on January 1, 2013, and terminate on December 31,2014. At that time, if this agreement is not renewed all obligations of all parties to this agreement shall cease. All funds remain in the City of Camas Emergency Rescue Fund as of December 31, 2014shall be expended only for ambulance and emergency aid services.

Section 8. SEVERABILITY: If any section or part of this Service Agreement is held by a court to be invalid, such action shall not affect the validity of any other part of this Service Agreement.

Section 9. <u>TERMINATION</u>: Any party to this Service Agreement may terminate their participation in the Service Agreement by delivering a written notice of termination not less than six (6) months in advance of the desired termination date and by specifying in that notice both the fact of and the reason for that termination. The Taxing District terminating their contractual relationship shall continue to contribute funds in accordance with <u>Section 3</u> of this agreement until the desired termination date. All funds so contributed shall be expended only for ambulance and emergency aid services. Termination by one party shall not affect the contractual status of the other parties. This Service Agreement may be terminated at any time on unanimous written agreement of all parties to this agreement.

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Section 10. AGREEMENT ON FILE: This agreement shall be filed with the City Clerks of the cities of Camas and Washougal, with the chief administrative officer of each fire protection district, with the Clark County Auditor, and with the State of Washington.
