## THE READING DRAGONS EFFECT

We launched the Reading Dragons reading program in 2022, meant as a winter and fall companion to our traditional summer reading program. The concept was to incentivize kids to read by offering dragon trading cards for time spent reading, which could become collectibles and also be played as card games with friends.

This program became so wildly popular we were showered with positive comments from the community: from parents, teachers, and most importantly, kids! We held a design-your-own dragon contest, with the winner's design not only featured on a trading card but on a library card as well. We also designed a Camas-themed dragon named Camassia, who is purple like our town's flower, the Camas lily.

We usually see a dip in the circulation of children's materials in fall and winter, but not this year. Children continued to check out even more than before, and while we can't say for sure why - we have a sneaking suspicion the dragons are the cause.
