

**ADDENDUM NO. 3
TO THE
REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS**

Climate-Driven Wildfire Risk Assessment and Community Resilience Plan

This addendum includes clarifications submitted by vendors regarding requirements of the RFQ. Please see information below. This addendum is provided for the benefit of all prospective respondents.

Questions/Answers:

Do you have a tract size in mind for the five field observation sites that will be selected?

Site visits will be restricted to City-owned parcels. Most parcels are 10-50 acres in size, though a few are close to 100.

Are risk mitigation strategies related to parks, open spaces, and natural areas primarily focused on city / publicly owned parcels, and do these potentially include any structures or other values at risk on the property?

Risk mitigation strategies should pertain to the entire city. Most publicly-owned open spaces are vacant of structures but some contain utility infrastructure.

For future delivery of trainings, who do you anticipate will be delivering the trainings or is that still to be determined?

Delivery of training is still to be determined. Depending on content, it could be City staff.

Do you anticipate these trainings would be in person or online, and based on a certain length of time?

The City anticipates offering in-person and online training. However, format and length will be determined once content is established.

Are the trainings primarily intended for the general public or professionals?

Primary audience is general public and homeowners. However, the City would like professionals to benefit as well, especially as new development is planned.

For education related to code requirements, do you anticipate any wildfire-related local code changes to occur during the timeframe of this grant?

Code updates are not anticipated to occur during the timeframe of this grant.

Will you be requiring a budget breakdown prior to or after selecting a final consultant?

Budget negotiation will occur with the highest evaluated proponent after review of all proposals. Consequently, budget breakdown is not required prior to selecting a final consultant.

Would the City of Camas consider alternative wildfire risk mapping approaches in lieu of ArcGIS?

The City of Camas will consider alternative mapping products as long as they are ESRI compatible. ArcGIS is the City's primary mapping platform. Consequently, all data for this project must be ESRI compatible so it can be used for future analysis, mapping, and information sharing.

If teams include an introductory cover letter, does that count towards the page limit?

No, an introductory cover letter will not count against the page limit as long as it is no longer than one page.
